

Preliminary Multiple Subject and Single Subject Credential Programs

Quick Look 2013-2014*

Length of Program: 30-32 units (4-5 semesters part time; full-time options available)

Approximate Cost: \$530 per unit; \$15,900-\$16,960 plus \$355 per semester general fee

Program Starts: Fall (September), Spring (January), Summer (May)

Application Deadline: Applications should be completed at least 30 days prior to the start of desired semester of enrollment

Program Format: Classes typically offered Monday through Thursday evenings at 4:30 and 7:00

GPA Requirement: 2.75. Low GPA may be overcome w/satisfactory CSET score

Accreditation: Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC)

Graduate Program Application Requirements

- Application for admission with a \$45 non-refundable graduate application fee
- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution or the evaluated equivalency with a minimum GPA of 2.75. Applicants with a GPA below 2.75 may be considered for admission
- Official sealed transcripts from all colleges and universities attended sent: *attention Graduate Admissions*
- Three recommendations completed on forms provided from professional sources who can address your potential for success. Family members and friends may not complete recommendations
- Comprehensive essay of at least 500 words that includes the following:
 - Purpose for entering the program
 - Why you are suited to be a teacher
 - Reasons for choosing to study at CBU
- An applicant whose first language is not English and/or does not have a degree from an institution where English is the primary language of instruction is required to demonstrate English proficiency by submitting a recent test score from Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
- Prerequisites
 - EDU 302 Growth, Development and Learning *and one of the following*
 - EDU 300 American Public School
 - EDU 341/541 The Exceptional Child
 - ETC 305/505 Educational Computing Level I

- Take California Basic Education Skills Test (CBEST)
- Register for at least one subtest of California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET)
- Verification of Certificate of Clearance (COC) granted
- Written literacy sample
- Satisfactorily complete all four prerequisites: EDU 302, EDU 300, EDU 341/541, ETC 305/505 *or* Preliminary Education Technology CSET
- Satisfactory interview with Education Committee faculty member
