Length of Program: 62 units, option to add 18 unit Professional Clinical Counselor (PCC) or Forensic Psychology concentration 2 years full-time, additional semesters may be required for PCC concentration; part-time options available

Approximate Cost: \$640 per unit: \$39,700 for 62 unit degree, \$11,500 for each 18 unit concentration plus 355 per semester general fee **Program Starts:** Fall (September), Spring (January), Summer (May)

Application Deadline: Applications should be completed 45 days prior to start of desired semester of enrollment

Program Format: Classes typically offered Monday through Thursday @ 4pm and/or 7pm, some Saturday classes required; Special Topics classes not offered every semester

GPA Requirement: 2.75. Low GPA may be overcome w/satisfactory GRE score **GRE Requirement**: GRE **not** required for applicants who meet GPA requirement

Accreditation: Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), Program approved by the California Board of Behavioral Sciences to meet academic requirements for MFT and PCC licensing

Application Requirements

- 1. Application for admission with a \$45 non-refundable graduate application fee
- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution or the evaluated equivalency, with a minimum GPA of 2.75. Applicants with a GPA below 2.75 may be considered for admission
- Official sealed transcripts from <u>all</u> colleges and universities attended sent to Graduate Admissions
- 4. Three recommendations from sources who can address your potential for success. It is preferred that one recommendation be from a professor or instructor. Family and friends may not complete recommendations:
- Comprehensive essay of at least 500 words that includes:
 - Purpose for entering the program
 - Experiences that have directed your interest toward becoming a therapist
 - Religious background, present pattern of spiritual growth, fundamentals of personal faith and the relationship between your faith and professional goals
 - Influences that have shaped your present values and approach to life
 - · Reasons for choosing to study at CBU
 - A response to this question, "Have you ever received psychiatric treatment or counseling, yes or no?" If yes, please provide a brief explanation

- 6. Successful interview[s] with Director of the Graduate Program in Counseling Psychology
- An applicant whose first language is not English and/or does not have a degree from an institution where English is the primary language of instruction is required to demonstrate English proficiency by submitting a recent

test score from Test of English as a Foreign Language TOEFL or International English Language Testing System (IELTS).
