Length of Program: 33 units (4 semesters, full-time)

Base Cost: \$17,550 (\$484 per unit, \$535 per unit for ATR 535, \$355 per semester general fee)

Program Starts: Fall (September), Spring (January), Summer (May)

Application Deadline: Applications should be completed no later than 30 days prior to the start of desired semester of enrollment

Program Format: Classes typically offered Monday through Thursday evenings

GPA Requirement: 2.75 for unconditional admission

GRE Requirement: GRE not required for applicants with a GPA of 2.75 or higher

Accreditation: Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC)

Admission Requirements

1. Application for admission with a \$45 non-refundable graduate application fee
2. Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution or the evaluated equivalency with a minimum GPA of 2.75 for unconditional admission. Applicants with a GPA below 2.75 may be considered for admission with the presentation of a minimum combined score of 1000 on the verbal and quantitative sections of the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or a passing score on the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET).
3. Official sealed transcripts from all colleges and universities attended: sent *attention Graduate Admissions*
4. Three recommendations completed on forms provided from sources who can address your potential for success. Family and friends may not complete recommendations.
5. Comprehensive essay of at least 500 words that includes the following:
 - Purpose for entering the program
 - Background and/or experiences in sports, physical education or related areas
 - Short and long-term professional goals
 - Reasons for choosing to study at CBU
6. Current resume documenting all related professional and extracurricular experiences
7. Successful Interview with the Director of the Graduate Program in Kinesiology
8. Prerequisites
 - The Physical Education concentration requires a minimum of 12 semester units in Kinesiology including biomechanics or related course completed with a "C" or better
 - The Exercise Science concentration requires courses completed with a "C" or better in the following: Anatomy and Physiology • Exercise Physiology Biomechanics or equivalent
9. An applicant whose first language is not English and/or does not have a degree from an institution where English is the primary language of instruction is required to demonstrate language proficiency by submitting a recent test score from Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). The minimum

score required to display English language proficiency for graduate programs is 89 IBT. If scores are lower than this but higher than 65 IBT applicant may be admitted into a graduate program while taking required language courses to meet the minimum TOEFL requirement. If the TOEFL score is lower than 65, applicant may be admitted to the Intensive English Program.
